UNVEILING OF HONOR BOARD AT GOBUR HALL

There was an attendance of well over 100 persons at the Gobur Hall on Friday last, the occasion being the unveiling of the Honor Board. The board is a handsome blackwood panelled one, containing the names of

the service personnel of the 1914-18 war and the 1939-45 war who were residents of the Gobur district

The hall stage was nicely decorated with roses and other seasonal flowers, while fern fronds adorned other parts of the hall. Mr. L. V. Shaw (Presi-dent of the Gobur Hall Committee) officiated as chairman of proceedings, which commenced with the singing of the National Anthem.

The hall committee were responsible for the erection of the Honor Board. The district residents contributed towards the cost of same.

The chairman, in a short and fitting address, explained the purpose of the gathering, and called on Cr. R. J. Briggs (President of the Shire) to unveil the board.

Cr. Briggs, in an appropriate ad-dress, referred to the acts of sacrifice made by service personnel, and impressed on the gathering present how necessary it was to extend a helping hand to them when in need, and not to feel that they were an encumbrance on them. All must realise that it was through the agency of the service personnel that the world would be able to go on. The speaker stated that the world would be better if all thought they were dependent on one another, and cultivated the belief that they were neighbors. Everyone should be enabled to live, and live decently. Cr. Briggs made an earnest appeal to all to remember those members of the services who failed to return, and the sacrifice made by them. All should bear in minds the words, "Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friend." Cr. Briggs then performed the nuveiling ceremony.

Supporting speeches were made by Crs. R. F. Almond, C. N. Davy and D. E. Weeks.

The chairman extended a word of thanks to the President of the Shire and his colleagues for attending the function, and also to all for their help.

Cr. Briggs responded in a suitable manner, and said that it was a decided pleasure. He was sure he was voicing the sentiments of his colleagues by saying that. He assured the gathering at any time they needed assistance of a similar nature it would be readily given.

A vote of thanks was accorded the chairman, by Mr. A. Enterkin.
