Ptes. Geo. Wixted and Percy Cook have been wounded, and Pte. W. J. McInnes has been a prisoner of war since 20.7.116.

Mr. H. McInnis, on behalf of the boys whose names were on the roll, thanked the people of Bellimbopinni and Seven Oaks for erecting such a handsome honour roll to their memory. He mentioned that the board, which is of hammered copper-plate, cost £7 9s 9d, and that there was a balance in hand of £1 19s 8d.

Other speakers were Cr. Kissane, Mr G. M. Perrett, and the Rev. Chambers.

The singing of the National Anthem brought the formal part of the ceremony to a close. Choice refreshments were provided by the ladies; and, immediately prior to dispersing, the crowd gave cheers for the boys at the from, and for Mr Peter Bowling and his five fighting sons.
