After the Archbishop had dedicated the new church to the Glory of God the official party. followed by the congregation, proceeded to the outside of the building, where His Excellency the Governor unveiled a mem-orial tablet. The new church was erected to meet the needs of expanding population of the district, also as a fitting mem. orial to servicemen who paid the supreme sacrifice in the recent world war. His Ex-cellency said that it was only right that some regard should be paid to those men who left the district to go overseas and fight for us, and by so doing saved for us everything we hold deer.
