Lecton Presbyterian Memorial Church

Wednesday, March 24th was an historic date for the Lecton Presbyterian Church. On this day a Congregational meeting was held and it was unanimously decided that the time was ripe to call tenders for the erection of the Memorial Church.

Plans us prepared by the Church architect (Mr. Finley Munro) depict a very beautiful Finley building in red brick with graceful tower and spire rising at the northern or front portion of the building. The length of the church is 83 feet and there will be seating capacity for 2-m persons. It is very well appoint ed inside with a Minister's room 13" x 12' 6" and a choir room 13" x 13 on either side at the read of the building These two rooms being connected by a passageway.

The whole structure has a strong artistic appeal and when completed it will be a building of which faceton will be encomonsly proud.

The members of Lecton Pres byterian, particularly the timid Ladies, have been working bard for many years towards the filfilment of their dream of a new church and now that it has advanced to the stage where they can call tenders their entires iasm is infectious. During these years whilst the Bailding 1 and has grown, so also has the membership of the church and the Sunday School has diversioned in such an extent that its work is seriously hampered by the cramped conditions under which it operates. Complete plans and specifications are now available and in the hands of Rev H & Durbin. It is proposed to call tenders as soon as possible and proceed with the work.
