WAYVILLE SOLDIERS' MEMORIAL

A large and representative gathering of soldiers, relatives, and residents of the district were present at the Wayville Institute on Wednesday evening when a Soldiers' Memorial Porch was formally defleated and a memorial Rablet unveiled. The porch consists of Teatree Gully free-tone, and has been creeted at the main entrance of the institute. The Chairman of the Wayville Vigilance Committee (Mr. W. C. Torode) supervised the work, the money for which was raised by local subscription. The tablet is on the wall inside the porch, and is composed of polished Swedish granite. The number of enlistments from the Paville district was 10s, and the tablet contains the mames of the following soldiers who fell on active service:—R. Chadwick, A. H. Chapman, E. G. T. Cark, A. Growther, H. E. Ellis, G. H. F. Davies, L. V. Duxbury, R. C. Griffiths, A. J. Hopkins, P. E. Jackson, A. L. Miller, H. A. Follard, and A. E. Sheard The name of H. G. Collins has not yet been included. The porch was diclared open by the Mayor of Unley (Mr. W. H. Langsam), and the tablet was unveiled by Col. S. P. ice Weir D.S.O. They were received by a guard of hanour consisting of local Red Cross workers, in charge of Mrs. J. Bailantyne (President) and Mrs. W. C. Torode (se extary). The "Lag, Post" was bounded by Bagier Allan Dale. Mr. H. J. Doeble then hanied the porch and tablet over to the trustee. of whom Mr. W. Muinden is Chairman. A selection of the hall.
