

## ALL SAINTS' HONOUR BOARDS.

### THE CEREMONY.

As briefly stated in yesterday's issue the Honor Boards containing the names of 161 men and one nurse, who have volunteered, were unveiled at All Saints' Church on Sunday night last. The service was partly occupied by a War Litany. At the conclusion of this, the Boards were unveiled. Mrs. Joshua Bray, who helped to perform the ceremony, has four sons at the front, and Mrs. Cheers, who also unveiled a Board, has two sons at the front. Directly after the unveiling, a hymn for absent friends was sung. The Rev. Owens preached from the text, Hebrews 12-1, "Therefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily best us, and let us run with patient endurance, the race that is set before us." He stressed, in the course of his sermon, the fact that the Honor Boards were not merely placed in position to show those who were serving and fallen, but as a reminder to all worshippers, of the beauty and nobility of self-sacrifice.

The Boards have been placed in position on the south side of the building, between the windows. They are made of silky oak, suitably inscribed and headed, the work of John Hicks and Co., Brisbane.
