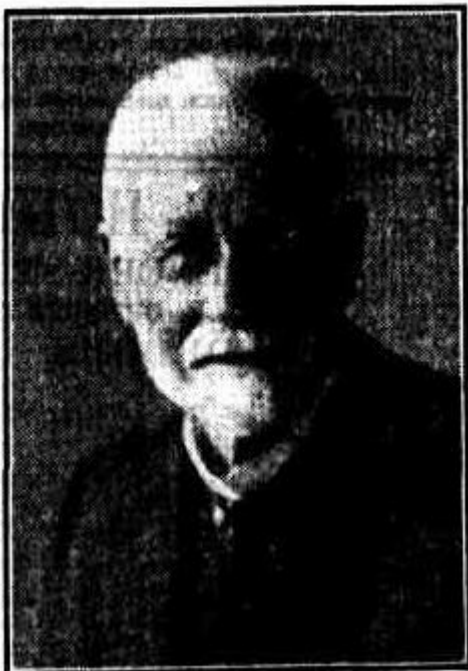


OBITUARY.

MR. W. ANDERSON.

The death occurred yesterday of Mr. William Anderson, of Ben Boyd-road, Neutral Bay. Mr. Anderson retired from the municipal life of North Sydney about three years ago, after having served on the council for 40 years. He was in his 83rd year.



Born in Victoria, and educated at Edinburgh, Mr. Anderson, when a young man, joined the hardware firm of McLean Bros. and Riggs at Melbourne, subsequently coming to Sydney as manager. On the firm's interests being acquired by Lasseter and Co., Mr. Anderson went on the land, and acquired an extensive property at Toole's Creek, near Wagga, which he held for some years. Selling out, he returned to North Sydney, and made municipal politics his chief interest. He was in large measure responsible for the reclamation of what is now Anderson Park, at the head of Neutral Bay. Mr. Anderson was an active member of the Neutral Bay Presbyterian Church, with which he had been associated since its inception, and was a North Sydney "Orphan."

Mr. Anderson leaves a widow, two sons—Mr. William Thomas Anderson, supervising engineer, Department of Public Works, and Dr. J. T. Anderson, who is in practice at Willoughby—and one daughter, Miss A. B. Anderson.

The funeral will take place at Gore Hill Cemetery.
