

DEATH OF DR. H. E. DUNSTONE Fourth Year As Mayor Of St. Peter's

Dr. Horace Edgar Dunstone, who was Mayor of St. Peters, died in a private hospital in Adelaide yesterday after a short illness.

Dr. Dunstone was born at Beetaloo, South Australia, on May 7, 1890. He was the son of the late Mr. John Dunstone. Educated at LeFevre Peninsula School and Largs Bay College, Dr. Dunstone graduated at the Adelaide University in 1912. He was a member of the British Medical Association, and practised at Hammond, Port Augusta, Booleroo Centre, Jamestown, Mile End, and St. Peters.

Dr. Dunstone was elected councillor for Maylands Ward in the St. Peters Corporation in 1932 and was re-elected Mayor of St. Peters for the fourth time on Saturday.

He was an enthusiastic Freemason and recently had the order of the 30th Degree of the Ancient and Accepted Rite conferred upon him.

A prominent sportsman, Dr. Dunstone was surgeon to the Port Adelaide Football Club, and acted as honorary surgeon to many other junior football and cricket association teams. At college, he was an outstanding athlete, participating in all sports, including football, cricket, tennis and wrestling. He was presented with a medal while at the Largs Bay College for the best all-round athlete.

Dr. Dunstone was a member of the SA Aero Club. His elder son, Sq-Ldr. Sydney Dunstone, also belonged to the club before enlisting in the RAAF as a medical officer.

Dr. Dunstone leaves a widow, two sons and three daughters.

It is expected that Dr. Sydney Dunstone will continue his father's practice when he returns from active service in Borneo.
