

THE LATE FREDERIC CHAPPLE.

Unveiling of Memorial Tablet.

The beautiful morning service at Kent Town Church was enriched on Sunday, July 6, when a Mural Brass Tablet, erected by the trustees to the memory of the late Frederic Chapple, B.A., B.Sc., C.M.G., was unveiled by Dr. F. J. Chapple. The service was sympathetically conducted by the Rev. Brian Wibberley, who, after the offertory, said that so great a personality as that of Frederic Chapple could not be permitted to pass from the Church militant to the Church Triumphant without evoking in the hearts of the trustees, officers, and worshippers of the Kent Town Church the worthy desire that by some appropriate means a suitable memorial of his personal worth and public service should find permanent place within the fabric of the church he had loved so ardently and served so conspicuously for nearly half a century. Accordingly a commemoration tablet had been erected bearing the following inscription:—

In unveiling the memorial, Dr. F. J. Chapple acknowledged with a sincere appreciation the action of the trustees, and spoke with a fine reverence of his sainted father's religious character and influence. In the home, as in the College and the Church, he had preserved in an unsullied life a truly Christ-like spirit, and had left a rich legacy of abiding religious and moral wealth. It was in Kent Town Church he had received his noblest visions of duty and his holiest inspirations of goodness.
