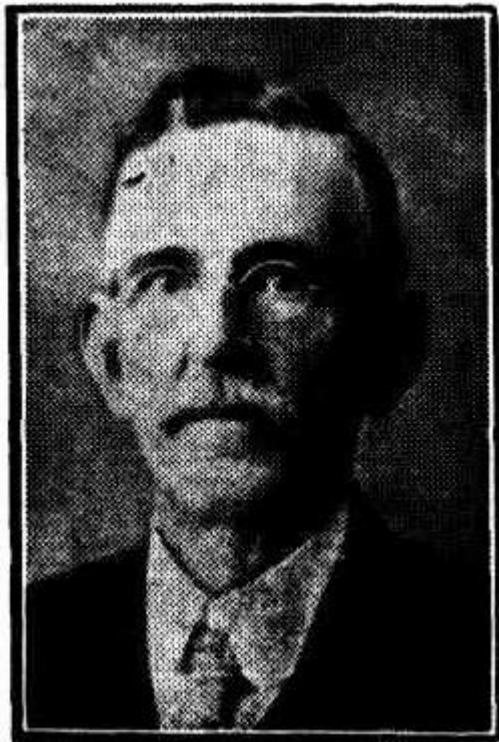


**MR. W. TAVENDER.**

Mr. William Tavender, a prominent business man of the lower north, died at his residence, Gloucester-street, Prospect, on August 17 after a prolonged illness. He was born in 1863, and was the second surviving son of Mr. David Tavender, of Angaston. After being privately educated in his home town Mr. Tavender jour-



neyed to the South-East in company with his father and brother, and after working on the land for a period he entered commercial life, conducting general store-keeping businesses at Waterloo (three years), Stockport (seven years), and Watervale. Owing to ill-health he retired from active participation in business in 1916. He took an active part in all matters pertaining to the welfare of the districts in which he lived. He left a widow and son, also two grandchildren. The eldest son, Private R. N. Tavender, 27th Battalion, died on active service in 1916.
