UNVEILING OF NEW HONOUR ROLL.

Last Saturday evening in the new Memorial Hall at Wanaaring, the new Honour Roll was unveiled by Mr. G. Treweeke. The hall was filled to capacity, many people having travelled long distances to be present at the ceremony. The Honour Roll itself was attached to the far end wall of the hall adacent to the supper room and during the early part of the evening was draped with two Union Jacks.

Dancing came to a standstill at about 10.15 p.m. when all of the returned men and women present were seated on chairs in two rows either side of the Honor Roll, Mr. T. Handcock opened the ceremony vith a few introductory remarks and introduced the speakers. expressed the Committee's pride in having the Honour Roll at last completed and ready for unveiling after such a long wait. Next to peak was Mr. W. Davis, who was a representative of the Bourke Branch of the R.S.L. He expressed his pleasure in being present, and on behalf of the Bourke members of the R.S.L. congratulated the beople of Wanaaring on their achlevement, Mr. G. Treweeke then proceeded with the unveiling speech at the conclusion of which he turned to the Honour Roll and eleased the flags which ealed it so that they hung neatly on each side.
