

Krips winner of song prize

CANBERRA, Thurs. — Mr. Henri Krips, conductor of the South Australian Symphony Orchestra, has won the Jubilee national song competition.

The conductor of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra (Mr. Eugene Goossens) announced this at the State concert tonight.

Miss Marjorie Lawrence sang the song, "Land of Mine," with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

Mr. Krips set to music a lyric by Mr. John Wheeler, of Sydney.

He won a prize of £100.

Mr. Wheeler received a special prize of £25 for the best unpublished lyric used in a prize-winning entry.

These were the words for "Song of Australia," which won third prize of £25 for Mr. Werner Baer, Springfield Avenue, Potts Point, Sydney.

Miss Dulcie Holland, Kameruka Road, Northbridge, Sydney, won second prize of £50.

Miss Holland set her music for her song "Australia" to words by Dorothea Mackellar.
