Churches Rebuilt After Cyclone

In March, 1949, a cyclone destroyed at Giadstone two ohurches, the convent school and the convent, and it has taken over six years to see the restoration of these buildings started on the sites.

Laurie, told his Excellency that the foundation stone, the baptismal font and the pulpit had been saved when the old St Andrew's had been destroyed and would be incorporated in the new church.

Four years ago Gladstone Catholics rebuilt both their school and convent, handsome brick structures replacing the old wooden buildings.

Seated on the site of the old church in beautiful surroundings and with the Giadstone Town Band, the High School cadeta, Boy Scouts and Cubs in atendance, Giadstone Presbyterians and their friends witnessed the impressive ceremony of laying the foundation stone of the new War Memorial Church to be ereced at a cost of £15,000.
