

NEW HEAD FOR WESLEY

Mr. W. H. Frederick

Mr. Wilfred H. Frederick, M.A., Dip.Ed., senior lecturer in education in the University of Melbourne, and a member of the staff of the University High School in charge of the school of modern languages, has been appointed to succeed the late Mr. N. H. MacNeil as head master of Wesley College.

Mr. Frederick is 45 years of age, and is a son of Rev. H. W. Frederick. He was educated at the Castlemaine and Geelong High Schools, and at the Universities of Melbourne and Paris. He secured high honors in both his arts course and that for the Diploma of Education.

In 1930, he went abroad for further study, and for some time was on the staff of the Watford Boys' Grammar School, in England. He also travelled in Germany, Austria, Italy and Switzerland.

After returning to Australia, he was appointed to the staff of the Teachers' College. For the past 15 years he has been with the School of Education in the University, and on the staff of the University High School, where he has gained a high reputation as lecturer and teacher. He has also achieved a wide and well-deserved reputation in broadcasting for schools. He planned and has maintained for 13 years the popular French broadcasts, which have been

taken as a model for other States.

Mr. Frederick is a member of the Methodist church, and has taken a keen and active interest in the youth work of the church. He is a past president of the Methodist Men's Society of Victoria and Tasmania.

In 1929, he represented Victoria in inter-State tennis, and was a member of the winning team in the A grade pennant competition in 1932.

His wife was Miss Moyna Diamond, who was educated at the Methodist Ladies' College, and before her marriage was music mistress at St. Margaret's School, Berwick. They have two children. Mr. Frederick will take up his duties as from the beginning of next year.
