

## Fine Example Set By Strathmerton Football Club

### HONOR ROLL UNVEILED BY CR. O'DWYER

On Saturday, May 3, prior to the commencement of the Strathmerton-Finley football match, an honor board containing the names of 43 playing members of the Strathmerton Football Club who enlisted for Active Service abroad in World War II, was unveiled by the President of the Murray Football League (Cr. M. D. O'Dwyer).

The honor board was erected for the occasion on the arena, and the players, in uniform, lined up in V formation, Finley players forming one arm of the V and Strathmerton players the other.

The president of the Strathmerton club (Mr. J. V. Bouchier), in introducing Cr. O'Dwyer, referred to the sacrifices made by the boys whose names appear on the board, and extended to the relatives of the five boys who made the supreme sacrifice the sincere sympathy of the club's officials and members.

Cr. O'Dwyer congratulated the Strathmerton club on the erection of an honor board to commemorate the action of its players in enlistment for Active Service, and thought other clubs could well follow the example set by Strathmerton. He referred to the part played by "our boys" in the defence of our country and to the hardships many had to bear for the maintenance of our free way of life. He wished that all those who had returned from their fields of service, would enjoy the good things of life, and to the relatives of those who did not return he extended his heartfelt sympathy. He then officially unveiled the honor board and asked that a minute's sil-

The ceremony was brought to a close by the sounding of "The Last Post" by bugler J. B. Cafor.
