## Memorable Day for Camperdown and District.

Thursday last was the day set apart for the visit of General Sir William Birdwood to Camperdown, and that day is one that will be handed down as one of the most memorable in the history of the town and district and shire. The people, irrespective of class, had a full appreciation of the General, gained first-hand through their soldier relatives, and it was their delight to honor him to the utmost.

The preparations for his reception were in the hands of the Hampden Shire Council, and they were carried out in a manner befitting the occasion. The President (Cr. S. G. Black) and the Shire officers had everything arranged to the last letter, and the town and Shire are under a debt of gratitude to the ladies who were responsible for the decorations of the interior and exterior of the Shire Hall.

Manifold-street was beautifully beflagged, and for this the Shire Council was principally responsible, but their efforts were well seconded by the whole populace, and it is doubtful if Camperdown ever previously presented such a thoroughly festive appearance. Festoons of allied flags in thousands flaunted their bright plumage in the clear light of a kindly Australian sun, and bespoke in a small way the people's appreciation of their guest. The flags and colors expressed the population's delight at the opportunity to honor one who has won such fame for Australia and as well the men who helped him do it. The decorations as carried out by the Shire Council officials deserve more than a word of praise, and none the less is credit due to the proprietors of business establishments in Manifold-street, some of whom went to considerable trouble to show their appreciation of the great occasion. From the clock tower floated a mammoth Union Jack, and everywhere else was "the flag that has braved a thousand years the battle and the breeze," closely in association with the Australian Flag, which was prominently displayed, in evidence. There is no doubt that the General appreciated the welcome.

Hundreds of people made an earlier rise than usual on Thursday so that they might be in time to participate in the first cheer to the man who led the men of Hampden, along with their comrades throughout the Commonwealth, through a long succession of victories—victories which thrilled and amazed the world. From early morn, apart from the busy throng decorating the streets, there was an unusual stir. In fact, many had come in overnight, and they spent the greater part of the day in the pleasant shade of the avenue.

The decorations at the Shire Hall presented a masterpiece of flags cunningly intertwined with foliage and flowers. The upraised dais could not have appeared more picturesque, and the stair banisters leading to the Council Chambers, where the civic reception was held, were none the less pretty, nor was the passage leading thereto. In all was a touch of Australia, gum bushes in bloom being prominent, which the General, no doubt, appreciated. In the reception room the table was particularly pleasing. The snowy-white cloth made a fine contrast to the perfect arrangement of delicately-shaded delphiniums, relieved with maiden-hair fern. No prettier table could be set for a King.

Long before the appointed hour, eager men, women and children began to congregate within the vicinity of the Shire Hall, and there was a fever of expectancy noticeable everywhere. Admirers of the General came from far-distant parts, and the estimate that thousands would greet the famous soldier proved correct.

The returned soldiers from all corners of the district collected in strength and fell in at the Drill Hall. On arrival of the special train from Terang, bearing the soldiers from that locality, they made, indeed, a formidable force. It was evident that they had not forgotten the days, fortunately passed, though but recently, of the battlefield. Their esprit de corps was perfect, and their whole attitude filled the onlookers with pride and admiration. Though the returned men thought not of it, their appearance in uniform thrilled all present, for they found it not hard to imagine the days when these brave warriors fought for the lives of others and their own on many a battlefield. A number of the soldiers were not in uniform, but they were none the less soldierly, and altogether they presented a fine appearance. They were under the capable command of Major J. H. Hindhaugh.

The Camperdown and Terang Brass Bands formed a procession from the station after the arrival of the special train from Terang.

On the appearance of the General, who was accompanied by Colonel Paine, A.D.C., the numerous throng broke into tumultuous cheering, which lasted for some time.

The General was then escorted to the reception room, where he was presented to those present and, afterwards, the Shire President proposed the only toast, that of "The King."

As General Birdwood proceeded down stairs to inspect the Guard of Honor of returned soldiers, which

down stairs to inspect the Guard of Honor of returned soldiers, which had been drawn up, the massed bands played "God Save the King," and the multitude burst into cheers.

The General then proceeded with the inspection of the troops, and the scene was an historic one.

It was characteristic of General Birdwood that the first thing he should seek was a word with his comrades.

This ceremony occupied some 35 minutes, and was most touching. He spoke a kindly word to each, enquired of their health and prospects in life, and expressed wishes for their future welfare. Particularly was he anxious to meet the mothers and fathers of soldiers and the young members of families whose kin had so nobly responded to their country's call. In the Guard of Honor was a representative of the Australian Navy, whom the General was delighted to meet.

The guard of honor numbered some 150 soldiers, and they included men who witnessed Australia's baptism in the Great War on that fateful day of April 25, 1915; men who saw the first Australian mount the topmost eminence on the rugged shores of Gallipoli in the grand charge of an army of untried soldiers, and saw him turn and cheer and then dash on; men who fought in Egypt and Palestine, and on all the famous battlefields of France, and who helped give the Hun the final knock-out blow at Amiens.

In welcoming General Sir William Birdwood,

The Shire President, Cr. Black, said it was a great day for Camperdown to have General Birdwood present. There was not another man in the world who had done so much for Australia as General Birdwood. (Applause). He did not know who was responsible for putting him in command of the troops, but none could have done better. He had the happy knack of being human and understanding the soul of his men, combined with the extreme rarity of being an extremely able soldier. (Applause). When placed in command of the A.I.F., General Birdwood was placed in command of fine material which, unless handled by some competent man, would never have reached the distinction that the A.I.F. did. Nothing could have been more happy than the manner in which the A.I.F. were led by General Birdwood. (Applause).

Cr. Black then called upon the Minister of Agriculture, Hon. D. S. Oman, who expressed his pleasure at being able to participate in so important a function as the welcoming of General Birdwood to Camperdown. The General had now a place in the hearts of all Australian people, and it was gratifying to know that such a large gathering had turned out to pay tribute to such a distinguished soldier. General Bird-

out to pay tribute to such a distinguished soldier. General Birdwood was placed in charge of the Australian troops, and under his command they had gained great distinction. The manner in which the soldiers had acquitted themselves had not in any way detracted from his able leadership. He had gained their unbounded appreciation. He showed that he was their warmest friend, and it had been said that he asked them to perform no task that he himself was not prepared to undertake. (Applause). He had specially endeared himself to Australia by his devotion to duty, and the interest he had shown in the soldiers. Many in Australia to-day owed him a great debt of gratitude for the information which he had supplied. He (Mr. Oman) tendered to General Birdwood the deep appreciation of the people of the shire of Hampden, and expressed the hope that he would long live to enjoy the honors which he had so nobly won. The occasion was not one for speeches, and he (Mr. Oman) felt that he should not speak any longer. As the oldest member of the important Shire of Hampden, he extended to General Birdwood a hearty welcome. (Applause.)

Mr. Gibson, M.H.R., prefaced his remarks by observing that he would be brief, as he knew the mission of General Birdwood was to meet the soldiers and their relatives. That was his special function at Colac—to meet the men who had fought with him, and their relatives, who were present on that day in such large numbers. The great gathering that day was a splendid tribute to the General, who had been instrumental in lifting this country into a nation, a nation wrapped round with a Union Jack. (Applause.) The name of Wellington had been handed down for a hundred years, and the name of General Birdwood would be linked up with that and other great Generals who had held the Empire together, and whose names would be united in a golden link that would go on for time immemorial. (Applause.) They were all proud to welcome back the men who had fought so well, and also proud to welcome back the man who had met with such signal success in leading them, and whom the people of Camperdown had the honor of welcoming. (Applause.)

Lusty cheers were given for General Birdwood at the request of Cr. Black.

The ceremony of unveiling the Honor Board was then performed by General Birdwood, who, from the platform of the Shire Hall, by means of a pulley, drew aside the covering flag of Australia.

The General then returned to the upraised dais and decorated the following military medal winners:—

The soldierly bearing of the military medal winners was evidence of the service they had gone through, and each was lustily cheered as the General pinned the decorations on their breasts, and spoke a few words to them, from soldier to soldier.

General Birdwood was received with the greatest enthusiasm when he rose to speak. He said: "I feel it a great privilege to be allowed to come here and meet you to-day, more especially as it is for two reasons—first, to unveil a memorial, and second, to present medals to the men who have won them. (Applause). I always do feel that it is one of the greatest privileges that one has, to be asked to take part in the unveiling of a memorial in honor of brave men who have come forward to uphold the honor of their country. (Applause.) On this roll there are some 1,200 names of men who offered their lives for the sake of their country, for the sake of the women and children, and for the freedom of our land. (Applause.)

The deepest regret is that among the 1,200, some 200 are marked with a star against their names—a star which showed that they had given their lives. No words any of us can use are sufficient consolation for the parents, the wives, the sisters of those who have fallen; but I trust it may be something to realise, as I do, that those men have not given their lives in vain. They fell bravely, giving their lives willingly, they went forward realising that they might fall at any moment. Men were heard to say: "I don't care for myself; my only concern is for my wife and kiddies." I think, therefore, that when we raise memorials they should take the form of homes for the widows and the education of the children of those who gave their lives. (Prolonged applause.) The best example I have seen is in Prahran, where the ex-Mayor got together a committee and raised sufficient money to build 16 houses for the widows of soldiers. These houses are now occupied by 16 widows and their children, and the rent is only 1/ per week. (Applause.) I think that various towns can go into this matter and see what can be done. If the future of Australia depends upon the children, we will be doing something for the children by attending to the matter of their education. When His Majesty the King permits me to present medals for bravery I consider it the greatest honor. The medals presented to-day are the Military Medals, a new form of decoration inaugurated by the King during the war. When you see a man wearing

inaugurated by the King during the war. When you see a man wearing a Military Medal you may rest assured it has been presented for gallant fighting in the war. It was impossible to present a medal on the day on which it was won. Generally a ribbon is given as soon as possible, as some time must elapse before the medal is inscribed. (Turning to the recipients): "I am very glad to have the opportunity of being here to-day to decorate you." It is a pleasing duty for me to go round the country districts, because I, myself, am a country man, proud to be in the country. There is a farm surround-

ing my home, and my interests are with the country men. I was glad to find that so many returned soldiers had decided to go on the land. I said in Colac that there is no good of any man going on the land unless he has some knowledge of how to carry it on. One cannot be a dentist without some knowledge of the vocation, neither can one draw up a legal document without the necessary learning. But some men think they can go on the land without any previous experience, forgetting that the pursuit of farming requires knowledge. I would advise the man ambitious for farm life to first start life as a jackaroo and gradually become versed in the essentials that make a competent farmer. Unqualified men go on the land, unskilled, and after a couple of months let it go, believing they are "let down." I don't think, however, the Government is letting you down. I have been through the various States, and I have come to the conclusion that there is no other country that is doing as much for the soldiers as Australia. (Applause.) The Federal and State Governments and private individuals are all doing their best to see that the returned soldier is getting a fair deal. And the returned soldier is, I believe, keeping up the traditions made in Palestine, Gallipoli and France, and if he succeeds in doing in civil life what he did over there he will be doing nothing to cause regret. There is always a half per cent. who will not do their best, and who are trying to besmirch the good name of the A.I.F. None has a right to go about begging. There is work to be obtained, and if all do their best Australia will hold a place among the nations of the world. (Applause.)"

General Birdwood smilingly alluded to the part he was playing that day—doing "over the top" duty by himself. "I would," he continued, "like, on behalf of the soldiers, to tell you what a deep debt of gratitude we owe to those who helped us from this place. The war was not won by soldiers and sailors, but by the morale of the people of the British race. (Applause.) The morale of the people at home kept us going. The Red Cross, Comforts Fund, the Y.M.C.A. and other

us going. The Red Cross, Comforts Fund, the Y.M.C.A. and other organisations did their best for us in the field. We appreciated it. We knew that if age and sickness and sex prevented you joining us you were watching and praying and helping us, thus maintaining a high morale—a factor which was, according to Ludendorf, absent in the German people, and by which he accounted for their defeat. I see only one nursing sister here to-day. The nursing sisters were held in the highest esteem and no praise can be too great for their splendid services throughout the war. (Applause). There were none better in the whole of the Allied forces than those nurses who served with the A.I.F. How hearty was the welcome given to our boys in the old country! The people of the British are not decadent—just the same as they always were; the same as the people who came out here—dauntless and full of courage. From the palace of the King to the humblest citizen, their homes were open to our boys, welcome wherever they cared to go. I had the names of 2000 people in England, Scotland, and Wales who had promised the heartiest of welcomes to Australian soldiers. Now we have our boys back, it is worth considering what might have happened if we had not been victorious. It was awful to contemplate. We would have been under subjection to Germany. We must never forget this that Almighty Providence looked after us from first to last. (Applause.) I will conclude by asking you to remember three words—"Lest We Forget"! The people's memories are short. The Germany of yesterday is the Germany of to-day and to-morrow. Do not forget that. I am not speaking in any revengeful spirit. Now I thank you for your very kind welcome. I may not, my old comrades, see you again, but I hope, should I come to Australia again, to see you once more. I wish everyone of you the best possible success, and may all the fruits of the earth be given to you." (Applause.)

The General then invited all the relatives of returned soldiers and of those who had been killed, to shake hands with him. He regarded it as a great privilege.

The General then granted the school children a half-holiday, amid loud cheers.

After the ceremony of hand-shaking with hundreds of relatives of soldiers, the welcome concluded. General Birdwood, in this, displayed the same spirit as he had done with the Diggers, and spoke a kindly word to the many who sought the honor of speaking with him.

At the appointed time Sir William Birdwood left for the house of Capt. R. G. Chirnside, at Carranballee, Skipton. As the car passed along Manifold-street groups of people cheered him continuously, the Gen-

eral making acknowledgments.

So ended one of the greatest days in the history of the Shire of Hampden.

#### THE HONOR BOARD.

The Honor Board is most handsome and substantial, and was viewed by hundreds after the unveiling. It was, prior to the ceremony, covered with an Australian flag and draped on both sides with the Union Jack and Australian Ensign, mounted on handsome blackwood poles, the flags and poles being the gift of the Shire President (Cr. Black). The Board will stand for all time as an expression of the people's appreciation of the soldiers of the Shire. There is probably as a memorial of its kind nothing superior in the Commonwealth.
