## Honour roll of fallen unveiled

TASMANIA'S most complete honour roll of fallen World War I soldiers was unveiled on Wednesday, as part of statewide Remembrance Day activities.

The honour roll plaque completes a list of 3165 World War I servicemen from across the Tasmania, and was unveiled at the St Helens Memorial Park.

Unveiled by Break O'Day mayor Mick Tucker and researcher Graham Cameron, the plaque honours about 4500 fallen troops and nurses from World War I through to the Korean and Vietnam wars.

"These men and women have been instrumental in shaping our country and it is only fitting that we remember them," Cr Tucker said.

The plaque was completed with a \$15,000 grant from the Tasmanian Community Fund.
