

"Victory Park" to be Built at Geerambat

PROGRESSIVE MOVE BY RESI- DENTS.

Geerambat has demonstrated its progressiveness with the launching of a project for the establishment of a "Victory Park" at a cost of approximately \$400. Being erected to commemorate World War II, the ornamental scheme will prove a great acquisition to the township, for incorporated in the approved plans is a children's playground.

The site selected is the vacant block of land adjoining the Mechanics' Hall, with a frontage to the street. The main entrance, which will abut the street, provides for a structure of wrought-iron panel fence, with ornamental double gates, set in concrete piers, with the word "Victory" as an archway. At the sides will be hand gates, while along the lane site will be a chain wire with concrete posts.

The children's playground will be at the rear, while the choice of shrubs for the park will be in the hands of the C.W.A. members. The initial work of levelling and planting of trees will be carried out by voluntary labor.

PLAN APPROVED.

A very enthusiastic meeting of residents, was presided over by Cr. H. H. Wallace, who gave details of the plan submitted. Those present were very taken with the whole scheme, and it was decided to finance it by a direct appeal, as well as entertainments and gymkhana.

It was decided to appoint canvassers and Messrs F. Saunders senior, and P. C. Trewin were appointed; while Mr C. Pearmain's offer to organise a gymkhana, was accepted.

HONOR ROLL.

It was decided to incorporate an Honor Roll in the Hall in the general plan.

A Park and Playgrounds' Committee was appointed, consisting of Cr. H. H. Wallace (president), Mr Alec. Allen (secretary), Mr Lowry (treasurer), and a committee consisting of Messrs E. A. Cooper, J. Saunders and J. Melke.
