## PLANTING CEREMONY.

Chauvel) at the intersection of the main approach and Government House drive. The recretary of the trustees (Mr. J. Barnes) explained vesterday that the trees would be planted in groups of tentaring at the western side of the central avenue, and proceeding up and cown the avenue and up the concretered, finishing at tree No. 1. Spades would be provided, but it was possible that some units would supply special spades, which could either be retained by their representative or kept with unit trophies. Speciaries of the unit associations and other bodies concerned who had not vet notified the names of their representatives should do so without celay. The trees from 1 to 31, along the concrete road, would be poplar dilatate (boplars), and the outside rows along the main approach would be agathat robusta (Queensland kauri). The inner row along that approach would be cuprussa toruless (cyprosess), and around the Shrine itself anumbers 66 to 85 biota, shrub trees, would be planted. Trees mumbered 70 to 80 around the south of the Shrine would not be planted until next year, as they would otherwise be liable to damage during the dedication ceremony in Norember.
