

DEATH OF REV. PAUL KEATING, B.A.

Rev. Paul Keating, B.A., curate of St. Mary's, South Brisbane, died at the Mater Misericordiae Hospital early on Saturday morning last. The deceased priest was a native of Ireland, and was only 26 years of age. He arrived here about seven months ago, and his death came as a great shock to the parishioners of St. Mary's, and to the many friends he made during the short time he was here. He was a young clergyman of great promise. Some little time ago he was appointed a lecturer at St. Leo's University College, in which institution he took a deep interest. The funeral took place on Saturday last, the cortege, which moved from St. Mary's Church, being largely attended. A short service was held prior to the funeral, his Grace Archbishop Duhig, assisted by a large number of priests, attending. Amongst those that attended were: Revs. M. Lane (Administrator), W.
