

### Rev. Father W. O'Sullivan.

The Rev. Father William O'Sullivan, parish priest of Booval, died at St. Mary's Hospital, Ipswich, yesterday morning. About six weeks ago

Father O'Sullivan contracted a severe cold, which developed into pneumonia. The late Father O'Sullivan, who was 84 years of age, was born in Farranfore, Co. Kerry, Ireland. He received his early education in the seminary of his native diocese, and completed his studies for the priesthood at All Hallows' College, Dublin, where he was ordained in June, 1890. Towards the end of that year he arrived in Brisbane, and was appointed by the late Archbishop Dunne to the position of assistant to the late Rev. Father Capra at Roma. Three years later he was appointed to a similar position under the Rev. Father Philip Corrigan at Charleville. On the appointment of Father Corrigan to Nanango Father O'Sullivan succeeded him as priest in charge of the Charleville district, and later went as first resident priest to Cunnamulla, where he spent several years. In 1913 he was appointed first parish priest of Mount Perry, where, with the exception of twelve months spent at Bundaberg, he remained until his appointment as parish priest of Booval at the beginning of 1918. The deceased priest was a great favourite with the clergy and people of the Archdiocese. He was of a most genial disposition, but very retiring, and was seldom seen in Brisbane. After an early Requiem Mass at Booval this morning the remains will be brought to Brisbane, and a solemn Requiem Office and Mass, at which the Most Rev. Dr. Duhig (Archbishop of Brisbane) will preside, will be held in St. Stephen's Cathedral at 10 o'clock, after which the funeral will move to the Nudgee Cemetery.
