

MITTAGONG.

On Sunday, 23rd September, sermons were preached at St. Stephen's by the incumbent, the Rev. F. C. Williams, in the morning, and by the Rev. A. Lukyn Williams, B.A., principal of Moor College, in the evening, in which special reference was made to the death of the late Rev. Stanley Howard. On Monday, 24th ultimo, a meeting was held in the schoolroom of St. Stephen's, at which the incumbent presided. The following resolutions were unanimously carried:—

1. "That this meeting desires to express its sympathy with Mrs. Howard in the sad loss which she has sustained by the death of her husband, the late Rev. Stanley Howard, M.A., formerly incumbent of this parish, who for four years laboured energetically in the service of his Master, and won the affection and regard of all who knew him."

2. "That in order to perpetuate his memory, this

meeting resolves to erect a suitable memorial and that a committee be appointed to carry out this purpose."

It was decided that the memorial should take the form of a stained glass window, and five or six gentlemen were appointed to collect the necessary funds. So worthy an object needs no special plea, but it is to be hoped that the requisite amount will be obtained before the 10th November, the anniversary of the foundation of St. Stephen's.
