

MEMORIAL WINDOWS AT SULPHIDE-ST. CHURCH

UNVEILING ON SUNDAY

At the Sulphide-street church on Sunday night two memorial honor roll windows will be unveiled by Messrs. S. Townsend and A. C. Dunn, circuit stewards, who were associated with the Blende and Sulphide streets churches before the union. These windows, which are of stained glass, were placed in position by workmen to-day. They occupy the end window at the right of the pulpit, and are of a most pleasing design. The coloring is artistic, and with light behind the effect is pleasing. The windows were designed by the leadlight expert of Mr. A. E. Clarkson, of Adelaide. When Mr. Clarkson was in Broken Hill the matter was placed before him by Mr. S. Townsend, with the result that Mr. Clarkson said that special attention would be paid to the work. The left-hand side window is devoted to those associated with the Sulphide-street church, while the right-hand window contains the names of those formerly connected with the Blende-street church. The windows are similar in design. At the top of each window amidst a wealth of coloring is the Australian Commonwealth Coat of Arms with the words, "Australian Commonwealth Military Forces" worked in. Then follows the words, "The Great War, 1914-1918." Beneath is a floral wreath, the wording, "Honor to the Brave," and a nicely designed cross into which is worked the names of those who paid the supreme sacrifice in the war. After this comes the full list of names of volunteers from each church, the bottom of the window bearing the words, "Lest We Forget." The opening ceremony will take place at 7 o'clock on Sunday night, the service being in charge of the Rev. E. H. Woollacott. Mr. Woollacott will speak on "Idealism in National History." The actual unveiling will be done by Messrs. Townsend and Dunn, and they will read the names of those formally associated

the names of those formally associated with their churches before the union. In order to display the windows to advantage special lights will be placed behind them. An invitation to be present has been extended to the Mayor, and aldermen, and officials and members of the Returned Sailors and Soldiers' League. The choir will sing "Crossing the Bar."
