

MEMORIAL DAIS TO BE UNVEILED BY COL. BRUXNER

The Memorial Dais in Anzac Park in honour of the men and women of Glen Innes and district who served in the 1939-1945 War, will be unveiled by Col. M. F. Bruxner D.S.O., M.L.A., at 11 a.m. on Anzac Day, Tuesday, April 25.

Recently completed, the memorial was erected by the Glen Innes Sub-branch of the R.S.S. and A.I.L.A.

The dedication will be performed by the Rev. J. M. McDonald.

The Anzac Day remembrance services this year will start with the pilgrimage to the cemetery at 8.30 a.m., when a wreath will be placed on the grave of each serviceman buried there.

In previous years the pilgrimage took place immediately after the service in Anzac Park.

The wreaths will be made by members of the R.S.L. Women's Auxiliary, who would be grateful if anyone having flowers available would hand them in to the Services Club or to any of the members on Monday.

The timetable for the Anzac March and service is as follows:

Assemble at Post Office 10 a.m.
Parade 10.15 a.m.
Inspection 10.30 a.m.

Laying of wreaths on the South African War Memorial and sounding of "Last Post," 10.40 a.m.

The parade will then march off via Grey Street, Wentworth St., and West Avenue to the Memorial Gates, arriving there at 10.45 a.m.

After a short service at the Memorial Gates the Memorial Dais will be unveiled by Col. Bruxner and dedicated by Rev. J. M. McDonald.

The usual Anzac Day service will follow and will be conducted in accordance with the programme which will be available to all attending.

WREATHS WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ALL ATTENDING.

The address will be given by Col. Bruxner, and clergy from the various churches have been invited to lead the prayer and praise.

Mr. C. B. Middleton, President of the Glen Innes Sub-branch will lead the march, and the parade marshal will be Mr. C. Egan.

It is expected that a record number of ex-service men and women will take part in the

march, and that the unveiling ceremony will be attended by a large number of town and district residents.

The luncheon for returned men will be held in the Town Hall immediately after the service.

The catering will be done by the Women's Auxiliary and it is requested that those attending bring their own cutlery.
