

## The Late Trooper Grey.

Arthur Percy Britton Grey was one of the first to volunteer for the New South Wales Bushmen Contingent. Being an excellent shot and a perfect horseman, he had no difficulty in getting enrolled. Mr. Grey, who was in A Squadron, went through many engagements of the war, the principal being Elands River, unscathed, but fell a victim to the deadly enteric fever, dying at Pretoria on November 9 last.
