



'NEW MEMORIAL WINDOW AT ALL SAINTS'
CHURCH HUNTER'S HILL

CHURCH, HUNTER'S HILL.

DESIGNED AND SUPPLIED BY MESSRS. LYON, WELLS AND COTTIER.

A VERY handsome East Window, of which we give a picture, has recently been placed in this church, as the inscription says, 'To the glory of God, and in memory of Shepherd Smith, late Synodsmen of this parish.' This beautiful specimen of Christian art is the work of Messrs. Lyon, Wells and Cottier, of Sydney, and the cost (£300) has been subscribed by the family and a few of the many friends of the loyal churchman and true-hearted Christian, who was taken from us in the prime of life, more than two years ago, leaving a blank in the church and in a large circle of friends which seems to be only the more felt as time goes on. With reference to the church at Hunter's Hill, nothing can be more appropriate than the chosen subject. It is taken from the 'Te Deum,' and the design has been admirably carried out by the artists.

The window will be seen to be of five lights, the central compartment being, as is meet, a representation of the 'King of

Saints'—the Saviour on the cross—St. John and the holy women at His Feet; while above are two kneeling figures of Angels, with their heads bent in reverent contemplation. The two compartments on each side represent respectively 'The glorious company of the Apostles,' 'The goodly fellowship of the Prophets,' 'The noble army of Martyrs,' each with appropriate emblems, and 'The Holy Church throughout all the world,' represented by a typical

out all the world,' represented by a typical figure of each of the principal races of man. In the smaller lights, filling in the arch of the window, are Angels with censers, and others bearing scrolls with the words 'Holy, holy, holy;' and the base is occupied by a beautiful reproduction of the 'Last Supper' of Leonardo da Vinci. The artists have further orders for three other memorial windows for the chancel of this church, and it is expected that ere long all the windows will be filled with stained glass worthy of the rest of so goodly a structure.
