## **OBITUARY**

Mr. W. H. Langham Mr. William Harold Langman, of Napier terrace, Hawthorn, died at a private hospital on Saturday at the age of 61. The son of Mr. Robert J. Langham, he was born at Glen Osmond, and educated at the Glen Osmond school. He entered the office of John Wyles and Co. in 1896, and became the accountant of the firm. He was also secretary of the Glen Osmond Institute. In 1913 he became a councillor for Unley, was made an alderman in 1916, and Mayor in 1918, holding that office for two years. During his term he was inyears. During his term he was instrumental in securing Heywood Park as a recreation reserve. In 1923 Mr. Langham was elected to the Public Library, Museum, and Art Gallery Board, of which he was president from 1935 to 1939. He made considerable researches into the history of Unley, on which he wrote a number of articles. He was for about 15 years president of the Sturt Cricket Club, and was a fellow of the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers. He was a keen lover of literature, Mr. Langham is survived by a widow and four daughters.
