

## Unveiling an Honor Roll,

### CEREMONY AT MOOROOPNA.

The present members of the Mooroopna Brass Band, the pioneer band of the Goulburn Valley, have provided a handsome honor roll to commemorate the action of their comrades in enlisting for King and Country. This roll, which contains the names of 18 volunteers, was unveiled at a public gathering held on the roadside near the Mooroopna hospital, on Sunday afternoon last. The ceremony was performed by Cr Robt. Pogue (president of the Rodney Shire Council), in the presence of a large assemblage of people, many visitors being present from Tatura and Shepparton. The function was organised by the members of the Mooroopna band for the purpose of honoring their comrades at the front, and also to assist in augmenting the funds of the Mooroopna hospital by means of a collection. The members of the Tatura and Shepparton bands were also invited to take part in the ceremony, with the result that over 50 bandmen took part in the march from the Fire Brigade station to the hospital. A returned soldier acted as drum major, and Mr J. Griffin, the local bandmaster, had charge of the combined bands. The programme of music rendered was a very fine one.

Cr D. McLennan, J.P., presided, and interesting addresses were delivered by Mr R. Casses and Sergeant Tracy, a returned soldier.

The chairman mentioned that one of the boys—Garnet Robins—whose name appeared on the board, had been killed. He had a splendid record for bravery, and a few months before his death, had been awarded the military medal for conspicuous bravery in the firing line. Eight of the others had been wounded, and one was missing.
