

FORESTERS' ROLL OF HONOR.

The unveiling of a roll of honor to the members of the Flinders Court of the Foresters Lodge who have volunteered for active service, took place in the Streaky Bay institute on Wednesday evening last, when, despite an excessively boisterous night, a good number attended. Chief-Ranger J. H. Cotton occupied the chair, and proceedings opened with the singing of the National Anthem, following which was an overture from Miss Old, played in her usual satisfying manner; a very credible rendering of the song, "The British Navy," also a sailor's hornpipe, by little Sylvia Revill; and well received songs, "Cupid's I.O.U." and "Laddie in Khaki," from Misses Winnie Anderson and Milly R. Campbell, respectively. Then came the unveiling ceremony. Members of the lodge occupied seats on the platform, and the C.R., after heartily welcoming the guests present and expressing the view of the body in procuring the roll as that of showing their gratitude and admiration of the 18 members who had gone forth to do and, perhaps, die for the nation, asked the senior-C.R. (Mr J. F. Gardner) to unveil the roll. Mr Gardner briefly reviewed the history of the lodge, which, strangely coincidental, was established under the guidance of, and first led by, the only member who had as yet fallen, viz., C.R. R. Skinner, a brother who had made great sacrifices to see them established, he being the only C.R. then in the district. The value of friendly societies was constantly being brought home to them, and only that evening their lodge had received a letter from a member now in the forces in England, emphasising the good-fellowship extended to him
