and Burnett. The deceased clergy-man had been alling for several months. He was the youngest son of the late Archdeacon E. C. Osborn, and was born at Kangaroo Point 56 years ago. He was educated at Southport School and Keble College. Oxford, where he gradu-MA. His theological training was obtained at Ely Theological College, and he was ordained deacon in 1913 and priest in 1914. After a period of service in England he joined the Church Army there in 1918 and went to France as a chaplain with the Imperial Forces. In 1918 he joined the B.E.F. Returning to Queensland as a chaplain in the A.I.F., he became curate to his father at St. Andrew's. Lutwyche, and was appointed rector there when his father retired from that position in 1929. He was appointed rector of Christ Church, Bundaberg, in 1928, and had a most successful period of service there. He is survived by his widow, who was Miss Cordelia Mary Jones and Mrs Jones, of Bangor Cathedrai, Wales, also by three sons—Sergeant R. E. Osborn, RAAF, a prisoner of war' in Italy, Sub-Licutenant J. E. S. Osborn, RAAN; and Mr. A. C. Osborn, who is in Bundaberg.

The funeral will take place from Christ Church, Bundaberg, at 3 pm tomorrow.
