

HONOUR BOARD UNVEILED AT BULLYARD.

At the request of the Bullyard Patriotic Committee, Mr. W. G. Gibson (Binger), in the unavoidable absence of the Hon. Angus Gibson, M.L.C., unveiled a handsome honour board in the Bullyard public hall yesterday afternoon. A large attendance of residents of the district. A short service was conducted by Rev. Rothwell of South Kolon, and the following hymns were rendered: "O God our Help in Ages Past"; "Peace, Perfect Peace," and "Abide With Me." Mr. Gibson, in appropriate terms, congratulated the residents of the Bullyard district on their patriotic spirit. Corbett, were those of Methodist missionaries in the district prior to their enlistment. As a tribute to the two fallen heroes he asked all present to stand while the board was being unveiled.
