Tree Planting Campaign.

In connection with the State wide Tree planting campaign, inaugurated by the R.S. & S.I.L.A., the Returned Soldiers of Blyth have planted an avenue of pine trees, half a mile long, west of the township. This has been named "The Avenue of Remembrance" and was opened on Saturday last by Mr. E. S. McHugh, M.H.R., who planted the first tree.
