## KANGAROO GROUND.



To perpetuate the memory of the late Mr. James Nicholas, of Kangaroo Ground, who had labored for many years as an ardent church worker and progressive public man, a mural tablet was erected at the Presbyterian Church, Kangaroo Ground, and veiled on Sunday last by Rev. R. W. Casboult. The late Mr. Nicholas had been a State school teacher at Yarra Gien for about 20 years, and later at Kangaroo Ground, where he finished his scholastic career. He took keen interest in church work, and was a well known figure in the pulpit of the Presbyterian Church. Shortly after his death a movement was inaugurated by the church people to keep fresh the memory of a truly good man. When this became known offers assistance were received from all sections of the community, and contributions were so generous that money sufficient to erect a handsome mural tablet was subscribed. The unveiling was carried out by Rev. R. W. Casboult, who referred in glowing terms to the very many fine qualities of the late Mr. Nicholas. In a short, appreciative address he took for his text "There is nothing covered that shall not be revealed, and nothing hidden that shall not be made known. He said the records of every man were embraced in the immutable memory of God, who never forgot, and after the final unrolling of our characters God would weigh our good deeds as well as our ill deeds, so that there would be an impartial judgment. was a large congregation present, the capacity of the church being taxed to its utmost. The visitors included many members of the Church of England University Students' Christian movement, with their leader, Rev. L. Backwell.
