The char-ter is number 5839, which is ap-proximately the number of clubs in existence throughout the world embracing almost a quarter of a

in existence throughout the world embracing almost a quarter of a million members. Later in the proceeding Gov-ernor Jones delivered a most in-spiring address. He dealt with various aspects of Rotarv and of-fered sound advice to the new members. He wished the club a long and useful life of service. He said that they would find many avenues in community service but avenues in community service but warned that they must be on their warned that they must be on their guard against creating the idea that Rolary wished to interfere with the civic or community life of the community. The real sur-pose of Rotary was to assist in the promotion of worthy com-munity objects and to foster pub-lic institutions which require help Having acclaimed the four ob-jects of Rotary the Governor then devoted portion of his address to a review of the present world posi-tion, and the necessity for all men

ion, and the necessity for all men of goodwill and understanding to co-operate in the reconstruction of a war-torn world. The rebuild ing of the world and the rehabili-tation of men returning from the war would require the best efforts war would require the bast endto of all communities and here he felt sure the members of the Grif-fith Club would cooperate with their fellow eitizens in the pro-motion of goodwill and better understanding.
